This piece both captures the poignancy of this moment in Israel's history and also conveys the enthusiastic, hopeful spirit for the day when everyone can live in peace.

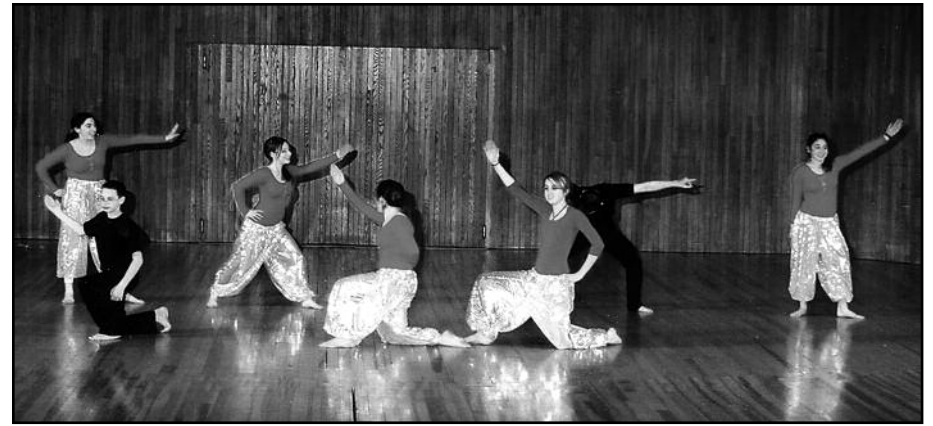

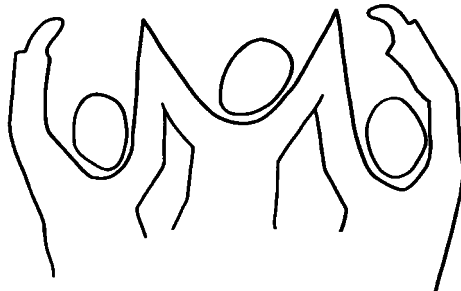
